#### Looking back at the year under review April 2022 - March 2023.....

Covid-19 seems like a distant memory now, but it was during this period that we were able to cautiously allow some freedom of movement, after the many long months of the lockdown, once the vaccine programme had been completed by the Midrand Department of Health.

#### **NEW WORKSHOP**

The work programme continued to operate from the temporary work spaces until August 2022, when with great excitement we saw the completion of our new workshop.

It is thanks to the design of our architect Warren Green and the excellent workmanship of our building contractor, Johan van Staden, that a workspace has been created that is warm, light and friendly, with an environment that makes us look forward to our working day.

We also now have a suitable storage area for the contract work which we hope will invite additional work from our companies and hopefully also some new work contracts.

The official opening of the new workshop was held on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 2022, with the officials and the marketing team from the National Lotteries Commission attending. This very successful and well attended event was held in combination with the Novalis year-end party.

**IN THE DAY PROGRAMME** the number of attendees is currently 38, which comprises of 27 residents and 11 day participants. The bus continues to run from Linden to Midrand daily which enables a small group living in that area to attend. The number of participants coming in from other areas remains small, due to the location being very far for families to bring and fetch daily.

The <u>ACTIVITIES resulting</u> from the contract sales provide a structured day programme for those participating. This helps each one who enjoys being part of a commercial activity to develop a sense of purpose and self-worth. The income also assists the organization to meet running costs.

It is most important to find a balance in the work programmes, to keep everyone busy, motivated and feeling a sense of participation in an important and worthwhile activity. A diversity of needs and interests necessitates the provision of programmes to meet each individual as best as possible.

#### **OTHER ACTIVITIES include**

**FOOD PLANNING AND PREPARATION:** Groups are rotated in this programme to participate in the planning of the daily menus, shopping, and preparation of lunches and evening meals for the residence. **MAINTENANCE:** The gardening and maintenance team keep the grounds well maintained. Duties include mowing the lawns, watering of the gardens, raking, sweeping, and wood chopping for the winter fires. **RECYCLING:** The recycling project continues and brings in a small income. It provides education, stimulation and keeps those people busy who prefer to work outdoors.

**HOME NURSERY:** A small project has been started to propagate new plants from the Novalis gardens. Should this prove to be successful these can either be sold in the Charity Shop or can be used to enhance the gardens at Novalis. Some of the attendees are ageing and becoming frail and are no longer able to contribute to a full day's work. These people cannot be put under pressure to meet deadlines to complete work contracts. Several also require individual care and support with activities of daily living. To accommodate these needs a special care house has been introduced to give these individuals a place where they can be quiet and restful during the day. A night shift has also been put into place for those who need night time monitoring.

# CONTRACT SALES

The contract sales for the financial year <u>April 2022 to March 2023</u> amounted to **R 165 961**, reflecting a deficit of **R 56 039** against the budgeted amount of **R 222 000**.

The income from the work contracts has dropped significantly since December last year. This is mostly due to a delay in the renewal of work contracts from government laboratories with Plastpro Scientific.

Sina, continues in her dual role of workshop manager and residential trainer, adding a wealth of support for our care staff and our beneficiaries, with her many years of experience in the field of intellectual disabilities. With several new staff members joining our team during this period, this training and support provides a vital need. We thank Sina for her ongoing passion, dedication and commitment to this work.

We thank the other members of staff who were part of our workshop team during this period - Ethel, Rocky and Joyce. In recent months they have also been supporting the residential programme.

In July this year Ethel moved over to the residence to take on a new challenge of Senior Careworker. Rocky is currently spending Saturdays at the residence to support the weekend activities.

Joyce fills in when necessary as relief caregiver in the residence.

We welcomed Ellen to the workshop team as bus and workshop assistant to fill Ethel's previous position.

We thank Thato and Jeanette, who have continued to successfully oversee the running of the residence during this period, despite the many challenges of the staff changes.

We thank our nursing sister Irene Cowley who

- Provides "in service" training of staff
- Oversees the administration and record keeping of all medication
- Advises on medical care for beneficiaries when necessary
- Provides referrals to doctors and clinics
- Accompanies residents to the doctor when necessary

**PSYCHO-SOCIAL SUPPORT SERVICES were provided** for the beneficiaries and their families by, Lennon Chikumbirike, who left the organization in January to take up a new position in the UK. We welcome Fanafuthi Pule, who joined our team as social worker in June this year.

We thank our team for their contribution to a safe and happy place where our people can live and work and providing a level of care we can be proud of.

# ADDITIONAL FUNDING - DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT DISABILITY UNIT

At the end of February I received a surprise call from Bilqees Mohamed, who is our case manager at the Department of Social Development, to inform me that Novalis House had been selected to receive funding for a <u>solar installation</u>. A few days later I received another call from her to inform me of more good news, that we had also been approved for funding for <u>security installations</u>. We sincerely thank Bilqees for her wonderful support and guidance, her regular visits to Novalis and for keeping us on our toes.

The solar system was installed into the dining hall to ensure that our fridges and stoves remained fully operational during load shedding.

We are still in discussions with the installer to see how we can extend the current solar energy supply into more areas. This may require further capital investment.

The CCTV cameras have been installed and are fully operational. The possibility of "off-site "monitoring of the cameras is being looked into.
