During the financial year under review - April 2016-March 2017, the decision was taken to close down the Linden Workshop and to consolidate the workshop and residential programmes on the Blue Hills property. Consultation meetings were held with the families whose children attended the Linden Workshop to address their concerns and to offer support and reassurance. The response overall was one of understanding the need for the consolidation. An Open Day was held on the 9th December 2016, where families who had never been to Blue Hills were shown the facilities here. Some families opted for permanent placement at Blue Hills for their family member and some chose to use the bus service provided from Linden to Blue Hills to attend the day workshop programme. Other families preferred to move their children to other centres that were more conveniently located.

Novalis Enterprises Linden Workshop

Just to give a brief history of the Linden Workshop for some of the new families: This workshop essentially grew out of Casa do Sol School when Sina was tasked to begin a work programme, when the children reaching school leaving age had nowhere to go, and Joy Tandy, then principal, asked Sina, who started working as an assistant at the school in 1980, to begin a workshop activity in one of the classrooms at the College section. Sina recalls starting with a group of 10 people from the "Bridging Class", assembling tap connectors in one of the classrooms.

By 1996 the South Road property had been bought and rebuilt to what it is today. It was officially opened by Mr. Cyril Ramaphosa on the 26th February 1997.

Under Sina's rock solid management for the past 20 years supported by her team, this workshop grew into the success that it was until the closure in July this year when the move to Blue Hills took place. We thank Sina for her total commitment, strength and leadership.

During the financial year under review - April 2016-March 2017, the contract work was steady, keeping everyone stimulated and busy and giving their best efforts to meet the deadlines.

Contract Sales

<u>Volunteers</u>

Eric Taylor and Ken Taylor were regular volunteers, helping with repairs and maintenance. Ellen Lekganyane helped with the collections of Woolworths donations form Verdi Centre in Northcliff twice a week, with the help of two staff members from Linden Workshop. The St. Stithian boys helped with contract work every Thursday morning.

The art students from Wits University visited on a weekly basis to do various creative and fun activities with our beneficiaries.

Blue Hills Residence

Our three supervisors, Thato, Joseph and Jeanette, together with the house mothers and maintenance team have worked to ensure that our residence remains a happy home environment for our residents to be living in.

Development of the property

The Site Development Plan and building plans for the new workshop, dining hall and Lavender Cottage were approved by council. Thank you Warren Green, for your concept of the new look at Novalis, the drawing up of our plans and seeing to all the council health department approvals.

Temporary Workshop

The old store room, which was crumbling and falling down, was converted into our temporary workshop using a donated steel structure.

Amphitheatre – R 991 000.00

The building of the Amphitheatre, funded by the N.L.D.T.F under the Arts Sector was started in August 2016. This project was delayed by three years, due to the delay in getting

the site plan approved. The main reason for the delay was the need for a Wetland Survey, which determined the building restrictions in the demarcated wetland area.

The second tranche of R 396 496.80 was received from the N.L.D.T.F. in April 17 and the project is now completed.

There was enough money from the lottery funding to purchase the paving bricks which are being used for the driveway, walking paths and parking areas.

New Workshop and Dining Hall

The proceeds from the sale of the Linden property have been allocated towards the costs of building of the dining hall, which has already been started and which will continue throughout the December closure period. It is hoped that it will be finished by the end of February 2018. The building of the new workshop will be put on hold until funding can be sourced.

POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

On the 27th July 2017 the Linden Workshop was officially closed and the move to Blue Hills took place. On the 1st August 2017, work activities resumed in the temporary workshop at Blue Hills. Other temporary work areas were set up in the Main House, to accommodate those who

need to be near ablutions and rest areas. We are still in a "settling down" phase with the development of the new programme, after the consolidation at Blue Hills.

Of the dayworkers previously attending the Linden Workshop, seventeen are attending the Blue Hills workshop programme, four have taken up permanent residence at Blue Hills and ten have left Novalis. The bus from Linden to Blue Hills is running successfully. Some families have applied for their children to attend the new facility, Hodnett House, which is opening in January 18 at the Linden property.

Despite all the upheaval due to the consolidation and the building of the new facilities, the residence remains a happy place. Four new permanent residents have been admitted, which brings the number of residents to twenty-eight. There are still nine vacancies.

There has been no interruption in the contract sales and work continues to come in steadily <u>Contract Sales April 2017 to September 2017</u>

The contract sales for the current financial year to date amount to R 113 380, reflecting a surplus of R 5 380 against the budgeted amount of R 108 000.

The workshop continues to offer a work experience for beneficiaries providing an opportunity for normalization where they can contribute to the economy and earn an "income". This provides self-esteem, empowerment and purpose.

Other work activities that are taking place:

Gardening, sweeping, raking, assisting in the kitchen with food preparations, general cleaning. Regular visits to the park and practicing for sports.

Overall, everyone is happy and enthusiastically participating in the daily activities.

<u>Sports Programmes</u>

We are creating new and exciting energy in the sporting area of Novalis. Regular practices are happening and skills taught. This is beneficial for exercise, improved mobility, gross motors skills and learning through team work and of course an improved chance of a sense of achievement when we compete with other organisations. Watch this space!

We are planning to implement a lot of staff training and development, all with a view to improved service provided and with the goal of development and growth towards independence of our beneficiaries.

There is a sense of "newness" at Novalis and with this comes new energy and excitement for the holistical development of our organization, creating a home that continues to improve and grow and lean towards empowerment, individualism and creating limitless opportunities for our beneficiaries.

Some of the new ideas

A social club has been introduced once a week, where beneficiaries have the opportunity to play games, socialize and have fun in a relaxed, leisure environment. This also enhances skills and interpersonal relationships.

The learning programme will form a part of life skills training and continued shared learning. This will involve discussions of topics promoting knowledge, practicing of basic numeracy and literacy, at individualistic levels. We are receiving a donation of I Pads and will start basic computer skills. The touch screens provide the opportunity for learning in a concrete and tactile way.

Social Worker

Karen Martin continues to consult with us every Thursday for a full day and is also available when needed, on request. Karen has a wealth of experience in this field, previously the senior social worker at Logwood Villlage. She is assisting us with policy development and departmental reporting requirements as well as providing psycho-social support services to our beneficiaries and families.

Masithembe Sikali, a young graduate from UJ, was appointed on the 1st September 17. His appointment has added strength to the team.

Jochen Kruger-Allenstein

In 2011 the N.L.D.T.F. approved funding under the Arts Sector for a recreational park in the wetland area. Jochen was appointed to undertake the project. He had previously lived on the property, as a tenant of Freddie and Susannah Dorflinger and had developed a love for the property. He was a passionate land artist and his quirky creativity is evident in the space that he created, in what was previously a swamp.

While Jochen was busy with the wetland project, the N.L.D.T.F. Arts Sector called for new applications. Not knowing what to apply for, I asked Jochen what he thought and he suggested that we ask for funding for an amphitheatre, and that is how the seed was sown. He put together a proposal which together we submitted and it was not long thereafter when the lottery approved the project.

Sadly, Jochen was brutally murdered at his home in Glenferness in August. Today as we officially open our amphitheatre we fondly remember Jochen. We will also open the park after the meeting for everyone to enjoy.
